Teachers' conferences

Headteachers and teachers meet each year in October to discuss matters of interest in the world of education. The meetings take place either in Paris or in another European city. They serve as a platform for networking and for the exchange of good practice on topics such as learning and teaching, culture and current affairs.

Pupil conferences

Every second year, youth conferences are organised on topics of interest to young Europeans. Examples of previous projects include: Baroque Art in Europe (Czech Republic); The Roots of our European Values (France); Man and the Sea (Slovenia); First World War Commemorations (Scotland and France).

Council of Europe (Strasbourg)

UCAPE is an INGO with participatory status at the Council of Europe. Twice a year our representatives attend the Education and Culture Committee, the Human Rights Committee and the Democracy, Social Cohesion and Global Challenges Committee in Strasbourg.
